

HOUSEHOLD WASTE RECYCLING

MIXED WASTE

- Plastic items
- Dirty cartons, paper and plastic packaging
- Gift-wrapping paper, packaging paper and wraps
- Toiletries
- Worn-out clothes, shoes and household textiles
- Vacuum cleaner bags and cleaning waste
- Cigarette stumps and ashes
- Chewing gum
- Pet beddings
- Small wooden waste

Take the waste to the waste collection point of your housing company.

BIOWASTE

- Food waste
- Fruit and vegetable peels
- Coffee grounds, tea bags
- Kitchen paper towels
- Plants

Drain liquids. Pack biowaste into a paper bag before taking it to the collection container. Take the waste to the waste collection point of your housing company.



PLASTIC PACKAGES

- Plastic food packages such as yoghurt pots, deli meat and cheese packages
- Detergent and shampoo bottles
- Plastic bottles, canisters and cans
- Plastic bags and wraps

Only clean and dry packages. Caps, lids and pumps separate from the packages. Throw dirty packages into mixed waste. Take the waste to the waste collection point of your housing company.



METAL

- Metal cans, caps and lids
- Aluminium foils
- Casings of tea lights and outdoor burners
- Empty and dry paint cans
- Metallic items

Only empty and clean packages. Take large metal waste to a sorting and recycling station or to small-waste station.



GLASS AND CERAMICS

- Glass dishes and oven dishes
- China and ceramics
- Crystal and opal glass
- Window glass and mirrors

Take the waste to the waste collection point your housing company.



CARTON

- Milk and juice cartons
- Cookie packages, flower bags, pizza boxes
- Wrappings of beverage packages
- Cardboard boxes

Rinse dirty packages. Flatten and pack tight. Take the waste to the waste collection point of your housing company.



PAPER

- Newspapers and magazines
- Advertisements
- Envelopes
- Copy papers and printouts
- Postcards
- Catalogues and books

Take the waste to the waste collection point of your housing company. Staples and paper clips do not need to be removed. Remove hard covers or plastic wrapped covers of books.



HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Paint, glues and varnishes that have not hardened, including aerosol bottles
- Used oils, oily waste (e.g. cotton waste) and oil filters
- Solvents such as turpentine, thinners and acetone
- Batteries of vehicles and work machines
- Plant protection products and pesticides and their packages
- Wood preservatives and wood impregnation agents
- Poisons and disinfectants
- New Year's tin

Take the waste to a sorting and recycling station.



ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

- All devices that require electricity, an accumulator or batteries to function
- Refrigerators, freezers
- TV, computers
- Vacuum cleaners, coffeemakers, phones, radios

Take the waste to a sorting and recycling station.

Fluorescent lamps, energy-saving light bulbs, LED lamps. Take the waste to shops selling them.
